General Membership Meeting  
May 29, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 7:45 PM by President Erma Gluck, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence for our troops home and abroad. Board members present: Erma Gluck, Bob Gluck, Paul Ziems, Vana McClure, Chris Reilly, and Jean Hartling. There were approximately 26 members and guests in attendance.

**OFFICER'S REPORTS:**

**Announcements (President Erma Gluck):** 1- TOB Job Fair to be held Thursday, June 13, 5:30-8:00PM at Brookhaven Town Hall. 2- Brookhaven Country Fair will be held Saturday and Sunday, September 8 and 9, 10:00AM – 5:00PM at the Longwood Estate. 3 – St. Michael's Day Camp runs July 8 to August 16 Wilson Ave., Gordon Heights. 4 - The 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Coram Summer Fun Concert takes place Saturday, August 10, 7:00PM at Fire Sub Station 2, Pine Road. Chris Reilly mentioned that the Longwood School District Budget passed with 6.7% total eligible voters actually voting. Due to community income levels, the federally funded free and reduced price food programs will be offered to all students this fall.

**Scholarship Presentation:** The Civic Community Service Scholarship was presented to graduating senior, Emily Sanders by Councilman Michael Loguerico. Ms. Sanders will study computer science at college and plans to work in the field of cyber security. This year's scholarship was made possible by a generous donation from Civic member Nimal Basra.

**Guest Speaker: Councilman Michael Loguerico** Highlighted a number of efforts and updates his office has recently been involved with. These included: recent demolition of the deteriorated Swap & Shop building; relocation of the bus stop that was in front of the Mott house; street light improvements with energy efficient LED lighting; discussion with the State to do earlier paving of Rt. 25 (2020 instead of planned 2023) and Granny Road at Rt.112 to Mill Road; safety improvements (added turning lane) at the Rt. 25 and Coram Mount Sinai Road intersection planned for 2020; Davis House listing on the National Registry of Historic Homes; the Taco Bell proposed for the Coram Plaza filed building plans in May. A question and answer period followed. Civic members raised questions about roadwork needed on the north side of Rt. 112 and Middle Country Road; a water main break on Old Middle Country and sand clean up needed; a traffic light at the LIE exit 64 west service road; safety concerns over traffic cutting through the

former beverage center lot; removal of benches at the bus stop near Home Depot; safety issues and lack of security at a recent fair held on OTB owned property in Medford; unavailability of TOB paper recycling bins for HOA, condos and private communities.

**BNL Update (Paul Ziems):** The BNL “Summer Sundays” program begins in July and runs for four Sundays. A brochure was available for Civic members.

**Next Meeting:** June 14 with Legislator Sarah Anker, guest speaker.

The 50/50 was won by Bob Gluck, who donated his winnings of \$9.00 back to the Civic.
